STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

- Do not put anything in a storm drain
- Keep storm drains clear of debris and trash
- Use phosphorus free fertilizer
- Shovel snow first & salt second
- Wash your car at a commercial car wash or on the grass (washing your car in the driveway allows water to flow into storm drains)
- Use practices that capture, slow, and absorb runoff such as rain barrels, native plants, rain gardens, and trees.

VEGETATION & TRASH ORDINANCES

Section 78-75: Prohibits overgrown grass 8" in height, noxious weeds, dead bushes, trees, and stumps

Section 70-05: Prohibits grass clippings being blown into the street

Section 58-17: Vegetation that is impeding public sidewalks must be maintained

Section 26-112: Unenclosed storage of junk, trash, and rubbish is prohibited

VEHICLE ORDINANCES



Section 70-9: Prohibits motor vehicles from being parked on any front, side, or rear yard

Section 26-64: Prohibits storing an inoperable and/or unlicensed vehicle in an unenclosed area

Section 82-130 (4): Cannot display vehicles for sale except in a vehicle sales establishment

TRAILER & RECREATIONAL VEHICLE ORDINANCES

Section 70-9 (2) - (5) One trailer six feet or less in height is allowed in residential zoning districts (one per parcel) as long as it is parked in compliance with Section 82-130. Residents may also have one travel-trailer as long as it is parked in compliance with Section 82-130

Section 82-130: Recreational vehicles and equipment cannot be stored in the front yard and must be 5 ft. from any property line
